Director's Notes

The action of the play is set at Elsinore, capital of Denmark.

Act One, Scene One, through Act Four, Scene Two, take place during a week in the present year.

Act Four, Scene Three, through Act Five, Scene Two, occur over the course of a few days eight months later.

Lord Olivier has remarked that *Hamlet* is the story of a man who could not make up his mind. According to the conceit of Revenge Tragedy, that most popular of Elizabethan/Jacobean dramatic forms, this is arguable as Hamlet does, indeed, make up his mind, albeit after many interruptions along the way.

It is these "interruptions" that make *Hamlet* a play or our time as they are born of dysfunctions: familial, individual, and societal. And the dysfunctions are myriad: lust, adultery, murder, abuse, and self-harm; emotional distress and mental collapse, coupled with dissembling, greed, and betrayal. All this against the background of an imminent military defeat and an occupation by foreign troops.

A perfect tale for 2024.
